RE: REPORT FOR JANUARY 16TH SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEETING

For my January 16th report, I asked my Leadership Team to identify 'One Big Thing!' in their arena that I could share with you in my report. That's 'One Big Thing' that has happened or is going to happen in their school or department. The results were exciting!

- In my world, the 'One Big Thing' is my trip this weekend to **New York City** with the student group from Traip Academy. We are excited for the trip! For several, it will be their first NYC experience. We'll see a show and visit museums. I'll have some details to share with you on Tuesday.
- Marilyn Woodside's 'One Big Thing' is the WIDA ACCESS testing for English
   Language Learners (ELL) in the month of January. Maine requires the assessment for all ELL students. We currently have 26 ELL students in Kittery and 6 others who are on monitor status. 36 states in the US use the WIDA for this purpose.
- During the week of January 22 26, Mitchell Primary School will be participating in the Great Kindness Challenge. The goal is to help children spread kindness and kind messages throughout the school, at home, and in our community. Want to learn more? - In the **athletics arena**, Mr. Roberge's 'One Big Thing' is freshman Jason Brengolini's 5th place finish at the recent Spartan Invitational Wrestling Meet at Sanford High School, and junior Isabella Woollacott's 5th place finish out of 48 racers at the first SMAA Giant Slalom race of the season.
- Jane Durgin's 'One Big Thing' is a process that Traip Academy engages in to support students with identified disabilities. The faculty has brief, 10-minute meetings (sort of like speed dating!) where regular education teachers and special educators meet to brainstorm strategies to more effectively and collaboratively improve student performance.
- Shapleigh School's 'One Big Thing' involves musical theater. Auditions and rehearsals will begin in January for Shapleigh School's first musical theater production! Over 30

students in grades 6-8 have signed on to participate. The group will be producing **Seussical the Musical**, and opening night is set for March 23rd.

- 'One Big Thing' at Traip Academy is the **Civil Rights Team's effort** to spearhead a dialogue about the 'r' word in Advisory recently. Unfortunately, the word has crept into some vocabulary and the CRT is looking to make the problem visible.
- Mr. Everett, our Facilities Director, reports that his 'One Big Thing' is that our newest
  custodian began her job this week at Shapleigh School. Kayla Hilton will be working
  with Tom Nudd and Jeff Powell to keep Shapleigh School clean. She comes to us from
  York Hospital where she had been a member of the housekeeping team there for many
  years.
- The 'One Big Thing' in School Nutrition is Mrs. Collins's roll out of her new Twitter account. You can follow her at **@KitteryLunch**. You may also follow her through the District's collective Twitter feed (**@KitteryDistrict**), but prepare to view mouth-watering photos of her team's work in the kitchens.
- In Adult & Community Education, the 'One Big Thing' is the department's **new catalog** which was released on January 11th. It will go out in the mail on January 29th to all Kittery residence. The spring semester begins January 24th.

- I am thrilled by the interest of many Kittery residents to be involved in our standing and ad hoc committees. Mrs. Dow will be making recommendations for appointments during our January 16th meeting.
- I also wanted to remind everyone that preceding our January 16th meeting, we'll have a **Public Hearing on the FY19** budget at 6:00 PM. The public is welcome to speak about the next school budget as we begin the budget-building process.
- On Wednesday, January 17th, we will be back together again for our School
   Committee Workshop with Steve Bailey from Maine School Management Association.
   That will be from 5:30 7:00 PM in the Central Office Conference Room.
- At our January 16<sup>th</sup> meeting, Mrs. Dow will bring up the dates for **future meetings** (including the February 20th meeting) and whether or not Committee members' schedules will allow us to keep meeting dates or make some adjustments. For example, February 20th falls on school vacation week. Should we keep that meeting as is, move it, or not have a second February meeting. In 2017, the February meetings were a week apart. In 2016, the Committee met only once in February. You may want to give that some thought prior to January 16th.
