This quarter students seeking their high school diplomas participated using in-person and remote learning options supporting a variety of learning styles, interests and needs. Our teachers were ready to support the movement between remote and in person learning as students and staff needed flexible options to maintain attendance.

Students learned US history through the lense of national parks which included a visit from Glacier National Park rangers. The English class built reading, writing and speaking skills using digital and social media explorations. The chemistry class observed lab experiments from a safe distance with a variety of technology solutions.

New classes begin January 19th with the addition of a business math class. We expect ELL and citizenship classes to grow in 2021. Enrichment, career exploration workshops, individual advising sessions and courses to help build skills for a diploma, new jobs, careers and interests are open for registration.

Multiple students have recently passed HiSET tests using weekly academic labs for direct instruction and remote self paced learning programs. Half way through the year we already have two HiSET and one diploma high school completions. Our academic lab is staffed with certified teachers, desktop computers and a device lending program for remote access for academic students.

We continue learning together in creative and innovative ways.
