Online Learning

18 out of 20 Traip Academy students successfully finished online classes
3 out of 3 Shapleigh students successfully finished online classes

Early College

4 out of 4 students successfully completed early college classes through YCCC and University of Maine.

4 students planning to take YCCC/UMaine courses this summer. I will actively support these students over the summer.

Internships

4 students successfully completed internships online with community mentors in the workplace pursuing their personal interests. Plans are being made for internships and the expansion of iLab in the fall.

Grant Related Activities

Department of Defense Education Activities (DoDEA) Grant in all three schools. Focus is on supporting the transitions of military and non-military connected students by educating staff, students, and parents about the importance of social and emotional health.

DoDEA funds will allow up to 35 Mitchell and Shapleigh faculty to attend four-day Responsive Classroom professional development training this summer. The grant will pay for Responsive Classroom training program in social and emotional health. 2 days of stipends will be coupled with 2 professional development days required by the district.

DoDEA funds will allow 10 Traip faculty to attend a four-day Invitation to Collaborate and Innovate. 2 days of stipends will be coupled with 2 professional development days required by the district.

DoDEA funds will allow 1 day of professional training in social and emotional health with Mike Anderson in August.
