The 2018/2019 school year is winding down. Field trips are abundant, and I have been enjoying the challenge of working with ever-changing student and mentor schedules to facilitate their weekly meetings. The end-of-year mentor celebration is scheduled for June 4th at Mitchell School.

We have a weekly 3rd grade math mentor group on Wednesdays, when a very talented volunteer works with a group of 5 high performing math students, to challenge them and keep them engaged in school.

Working with the Big Brother/Big Sister Program of Southern Maine, we have 2 Mitchell students paired with big sisters. We also have a foster grandparent volunteer working with Erin Cote 15 hours a week, and a second foster grandparent hosting lunch groups in the Mitchell cafeteria 3 days a week.

I also hosted a KSD mentor/volunteer table at the volunteer expo at the Kittery Community Center.

Mitchell Career Day	5 community volunteers for an hour
Kindergarten Registration	32 volunteers for 4 hours each to cover 4 registration days**

They personally escort them to all of the 8 or 9 registration stations, answer their questions and give them tours of the school. We could not do it without their help, and it makes such a difference for each new family to have a personal connection!
